#### A NOTE FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

I first became aware of the wonderful story of Sir Gawain and Dame Ragnelle when I saw it performed in the '70s in Chicago by Paul Sills' Story Theater. It was not only a heartwarming piece, it was surprisingly contemporary. What is it that women want? Might it be a better place if women ran the world? A good question as we may now have our first female presidential candidate. The politics of what men and women want inform our whole culture as well as our personal relationships and home lives.

The story of the Marriage of Sir Gawain is very similar to and probably evolved from the tale told by the Wife of Bath in Chaucer's Canterbury Tales. There have been many versions of this story through ballads and legends, some of which were collected and published by Sir Thomas Malory in his Morte d'Arthur (1415).

Alison, the Wife of Bath, is a character unto herself. She seems to have defied the pronouncements of the church and the nobility — a view among many that women should always be in their place. Whatever one's take on the Wife of Bath's story, composed by Chaucer over 600 years ago, discussions of women's position in society and the proper balance of roles between men and women have never been off the front burner as hot topics for life, politics, literature and drama. We hope you enjoy this gentle tale of Sir Gawain and Dame Ragnelle, or the Loathly Lady, as told by Chaucer's feisty Wife of Bath.
